Lighting of the Unity Candle / First Sunday of Advent (From Genesis 1 and Romans 5)

<u>Reader 1</u>: In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth. He filled the universe with stars and planets, and he filled the earth with plants and animals.

<u>Reader 2</u>: Then, God made mankind in his image, to rule over all the creatures and to have dominion over the creation. And God saw all that he had made, and it was very good.

- <u>Reader 1</u>: But when Adam and Eve disobeyed God, sin entered the world and the whole creation was damaged. The good became twisted, and the harmony of creation went off-tune. Every human since then has struggled with both goodness and evil in their hearts.
- <u>Reader 2</u>: But God gave them hope. Another Son of God would come to overcome sin, to heal what was broken, and to eventually restore goodness with a new heaven and a new earth. This morning we light the candle of hope.

Scripture Reading: Genesis 1:27-31; 2:15-20, Romans 5:12-17

Genesis 1:27-31

²⁷ So God created mankind in his own image, in the image of God he created them male and female he created them. ²⁸ God blessed them and said to them, "Be fruitful and increase in number; fill the earth and subdue it. Rule over the fish in the sea and the birds in the sky and over every living creature that moves on the ground."

²⁹ Then God said, "I give you every seed-bearing plant on the face of the whole earth and every tree that has fruit with seed in it. They will be yours for food. ³⁰ And to all the beasts of the earth and all the birds in the sky and all the creatures that move along the ground—everything that has the breath of life in it—I give every green plant for food." And it was so.

³¹ God saw all that he had made, and it was very good. And there was evening, and there was morning the sixth day.

Genesis 2:15-20

¹⁵ The Lord God took the man and put him in the Garden of Eden to work it and take care of it. ¹⁶ And the Lord God commanded the man, "You are free to eat from any tree in the garden; ¹⁷ but you must not eat from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, for when you eat from it you will certainly die." ¹⁸ The Lord God said, "It is not good for the man to be alone. I will make a helper suitable for him." ¹⁹ Now the Lord God had formed out of the ground all the wild animals and all the birds in the sky. He brought them to the man to see what he would name them; and whatever the man called each living creature, that was its name. ²⁰ So the man gave names to all the livestock, the birds in the sky and all the wild animals. But for Adam no suitable helper was found.

Romans 5:12-17

¹² Therefore, just as sin entered the world through one man, and death through sin, and in this way death came to all people, because all sinned—

¹³ To be sure, sin was in the world before the law was given, but sin is not charged against anyone's account where there is no law. ¹⁴ Nevertheless, death reigned from the time of Adam to the time of Moses, even over those who did not sin by breaking a command, as did Adam, who is a pattern of the one to come.

¹⁵ But the gift is not like the trespass. For if the many died by the trespass of the one man, how much more did God's grace and the gift that came by the grace of the one man, Jesus Christ, overflow to the many! ¹⁶ Nor can the gift of God be compared with the result of one man's sin: The judgment followed one sin and brought condemnation, but the gift followed many trespasses and brought justification. ¹⁷ For if, by the trespass of the one man, death reigned through that one man, how much

more will those who receive God's abundant provision of grace and of the gift of righteousness reign in life through the one man, Jesus Christ!
