WE ARE RECONCILED TO GOD

Lighting of the Advent Candle (From Exodus 2&3, and Matthew 1)

Reader 1: When God's people were oppressed by Pharaoh, many years after Joseph, God heard their cries

Reader 2: A son was born to a Levite couple. His mother hid him from Pharaoh's order to kill every male Hebrew child. And when they could not hide him anymore, his mother put him in a basket coated with pitch, and placed it among the reeds in the Nile, where Pharaoh's daughter bathed.

Reader 1: Pharaoh's daughter saw the child and took him into her home. She named him Moses, saying, "I drew him out of the water"

Reader 2: Forty years later, God called Moses from a burning bush, saying, "the cry of the Israelites has reached me, and I have seen the way the Egyptians are oppressing them. So now go, I am sending you to Pharaoh to bring my people the Israelites out of Egypt.

Reader 1: But Moses said, "Who am I, that I could do this?

Reader 2: And God said, "I will be with you.... I will bring [my people] up out of misery in Egypt and into a land flowing with milk and honey."

Reader 1: Many centuries later, an angel of the Lord appeared to another young couple, saying to the man:

Reader 2: "Joseph... do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins."

Scripture Reading: Exodus 3:1-17

Now Moses was tending the flock of Jethro his father-in-law, the priest of Midian, and he led the flock to the far side of the wilderness and came to Horeb, the mountain of God. ² There the angel of the Lord appeared to him in flames of fire from within a bush. Moses saw that though the bush was on fire it did not burn up. ³ So Moses thought, "I will go over and see this strange sight—why the bush does not burn up."

⁴ When the Lord saw that he had gone over to look, God called to him from within the bush, "Moses! Moses!"

And Moses said, "Here I am."

- ⁵ "Do not come any closer," God said. "Take off your sandals, for the place where you are standing is holy ground." ⁶ Then he said, "I am the God of your father, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac and the God of Jacob." At this, Moses hid his face, because he was afraid to look at God.
- ⁷ The Lord said, "I have indeed seen the misery of my people in Egypt. I have heard them crying out because of their slave drivers, and I am concerned about their suffering. ⁸ So I have come down to rescue them from the hand of the Egyptians and to bring them up out of that land into a good and spacious land, a land flowing with milk and honey—the home of the Canaanites, Hittites, Amorites, Perizzites, Hivites and Jebusites. ⁹ And now the cry of the Israelites has reached me, and I have seen the way the Egyptians are oppressing them. ¹⁰ So now, go. I am sending you to Pharaoh to bring my people the Israelites out of Egypt."
- ¹¹ But Moses said to God, "Who am I that I should go to Pharaoh and bring the Israelites out of Egypt?"
- ¹² And God said, "I will be with you. And this will be the sign to you that it is I who have sent you: When you have brought the people out of Egypt, you will worship God on this mountain."
- ¹³ Moses said to God, "Suppose I go to the Israelites and say to them, 'The God of your fathers has sent me to you,' and they ask me, 'What is his name?' Then what shall I tell them?"
