WE ARE RECONCILED TO GOD

- Responsive Reading God's call to follow his wisdom (From Job 28 and Proverbs 1-3)
 - Leader: There is a mine for silver and a place where gold is refined.... But where can wisdom be found? Where does understanding dwell?
 - People: It is hidden from the eyes of every living thing, concealed even from the birds in the sky.... God understands the way to it and he alone knows where it dwells, for he views the ends of the earth and sees everything under the heavens.
 - Leader: When he established the force of the wind and measured out the waters, when he made a decree for the rain and a path for the thunderstorm, then he looked at wisdom and appraised it; he confirmed it and tested it. And he said to the human race, "The fear of the Lord—that is wisdom, and to shun evil is understanding."
 - People: The fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge, but fools despise wisdom and instruction.... For the Lord gives wisdom; from his mouth come knowledge and understanding.
 - Leader: He holds success in store for the upright, he is a shield to those whose walk is blameless; for he guards the course of the just and protects the way of his faithful ones.
 - People: Blessed are those who find wisdom, those who gain understanding, for she is more profitable than silver and yields better returns than gold. She is more precious than rubies; nothing you desire can compare with her.
 - Leader: For the Lord detests the perverse but takes the upright into his confidence.... He mocks proud mockers but shows favor to the humble and oppressed. The wise inherit honor, but fools get only shame.
 - People: Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight.
