And also because God gives his grace and Holy Spirit only to those who pray continually and groan inwardly, asking God for these gifts and thanking God for them.

Prayer of Confession

more. Forgive us when we take you for granted. Forgive us when we do not notice you or thank you. Forgive when our encounters with You are distracted or diminished to an hour on Sunday. We ask you to forgive us. We ask for your Spirit, and more of your Spirit. For Jesus sake, Amen.
