Communion: Next week we will have the opportunity to celebrate the Lord's Supper. The Lord's Supper is the family table at which we eat together and are nourished with Christ's sacrifice for us. Here (as in Baptism) we celebrate who we are - children of God – and are reminded of God's promises to be our God, to care for us, love us, and be faithful to us. All who are baptized into Christ and have made a public stand for him are welcome to the Lord's Table.

The Children and Worship team is excited to welcome our children, ages 3-3rd grade, to worship with us during the main worship service. We will meet in the old "music room" or classroom 3, located to the south of the sanctuary. After the children's message during our service, the kids will follow the leader(s) through the exit door in the front of the church to get to that classroom. Please come after worship to pick up your child!

During our morning worship service, immediately following the children's message, children ages three through second grade are invited to attend *Children and Worship*, which meets in the worship center in the back of the fellowship hall. Children experience worship in the same order as in the sanctuary: we approach God in reverence, hear His Word proclaimed, respond in praise, and go forth in peace and love to serve in God's name. Their worship includes songs, prayers, Bible stories presented using wooden figures and felt pieces, and an offering of creative response. *Children and Worship* is a program for children learning to worship God, rather than a time to socialize or play. In a culture that competes for our attention and consumption, this is an opportunity for young children to learn to offer their attention and love to God. Each *Children and Worship* service builds on previous stories brought into the worship center throughout the year. Children are

encouraged to begin this age-specialized program at the start of the school season after they turn 3 years old. Visitors are welcome to attend.

Adult Sunday School Class: This week (Sept. 24) we will journey up Mt. Sinai and discuss the Ten Commandments and the building of the Tabernacle. Class will meet in room 7, hope to see you there.
