TCRC is the parent church for the new **Church Beyond Borders church**, planted by Rev. SJ Kim. This is a cutting edge "hybrid" church with a combination of on-line worship in Korean and English, small groups, and 1-to-1 discipleship and pastoral care. The church ministers to 2nd-generation Korean Americans who have disconnected from their parents' Korean-speaking churches. The church runs on a very small budget with most funds coming from the CRC's Resonate Global Mission and Classis Northcentral Iowa. As the parent church, TCRC also committed \$5,000 a year to this church plant. We have raised \$3,550 so far, so we still have a little bit to raise yet this year. Please consider supporting them.
