TCRC is the parent church for the new Church Beyond Borders church, planted by Rev. SJ Kim. This is a cutting edge "hybrid" church with a combination of on-line worship in Korean and English, small groups, and 1-to-1 discipleship and pastoral care. The church ministers to 2ndgeneration Korean Americans who have disconnected from their parents' Korean-speaking churches. We hope to have Rev. Kim here to update us again soon. Church Beyond Borders is off to a good start and growing, with a steering team of young Korean-Americans along with Pastor SJ! The church runs on a very small budget with most funds coming from the CRC's Resonate Global Mission and Classis Northcentral Iowa. As the parent church, TCRC also committed \$5,000 a year to this church plant. We have raised \$3,550 so far, so we still have a little bit to raise yet this year. Please consider supporting them.
