World Renew

Flood Response in California - In the wake of extreme flooding and mudslides, World Renew DRS asks for prayer for the Los Angeles, California, community. An atmospheric river event, which transports saturated air to regions as rain or snow, has caused storms leading to "one of the wettest two-day periods in southern California's record." So far, the flooding has resulted in 475 mudslides and 390 fallen trees, causing damage to many homes and yards. Pray for the extreme rainfall to cease.
